HEARTS TICK ON, KIDNEYS FILTER STRONG: MAAEDICARE FUNDRAISER BALL DELIVERS RM500,000 BOOST FOR VITAL CARE

Kuala Lumpur, July 23, 2024 – The air crackled with hope and generosity last Friday night as the Maaedicare Charitable Foundation, a Kuala Lumpur non-governmental organisation for kidney patients and heart diagnostics and awareness, celebrated a milestone 30 years in the making.

It was not just cake and speeches – our **Health for Humanity Fundraiser Ball 2024** pulsed with a life of its own, raising a staggering RM500,000 in combined cash and in-kind donations. This incredible sum will fuel Maaedicare's mission, expanding its kidney care programs at 11 dialysis centres, strengthening heart health initiatives through heart assessments at the Cardiac Diagnostic Centre, and bolstering health screenings through two Klinik Amal Percuma. This includes exciting plans to open more free clinics, bringing essential healthcare to even more underserved communities.

It was a night that proved compassion knows no limit, and the future for these vulnerable patients is brighter than ever. A silent auction thrummed with generosity, securing vital funds to fuel Maaedicare's fight against heart ailments and kidney diseases.

The prestigious Fundraiser was graced by **Her Highness Dato' Seri DiRaja Tan Sri Tunku Puteri Intan Safinaz Binti Almarhum Sultan Abdul Halim Mu'adzam Shah, Tunku Temenggong Kedah.**

Established three decades ago, Maaedicare Charitable Foundation has played a crucial role in offering subsidised dialysis treatments across its 11 dialysis centres in the country. The Foundation also runs a Cardiac Diagnostic Centre, as well as provides complimentary medical screenings to encourage early prevention of kidney and heart diseases through its two Klinik Amal Percuma branches. Cumulatively, the Foundation has served close to 32,000 patients.

Yang Mulia Tunku Dato' Yaacob Khyra, Chairman of Maaedicare Charitable Foundation said the funds raised would be beneficial for Maaedicare to strengthen its medical facilities and provide essential renal care to its 800 dialysis patients, effectively. Ultimately, he added that the Fundraiser sought to foster a healthier future by bridging gaps in medical services and uplifting the quality of healthcare across the country.

"Maaedicare's commitment to dialysis affordability has remained steadfast for 30 years. We began by offering dialysis treatment at a highly subsidised RM 99 per session, compared to private clinics charging RM 250. After 30 years in operation, Maaedicare today charges only RM 110 per treatment; an inflation of RM 11, and this has been made possible, through the control of costs, bulk purchasing of supplies, and careful management of investment funds," he noted, adding that with the sponsorship support of the Malaysian government, patients today, need now only pay, a typical net fee, of between RM 10 to RM 50 per treatment.

Tunku Yaacob added these crucial treatments have aided in extending the lives, of 24,000 dialysis patients who have visited the Foundation's dialysis centres over the years.

"Almost all have since passed on, but the quality of life we have helped them live, and the fulfilment of full lives they have enjoyed, cannot be understated," he said.

Ms. Anne Rajasaikaran, Chief Executive Officer of Maaedicare Charitable Foundation and Chairperson for Health for Humanity Fundraiser Ball 2024, said Maaedicare is proud to mark three decades of dedicated service to the underprivileged communities in Malaysia.

"Join us in building a healthier Malaysia! Donate to support our Foundation's heart health and free medical services initiatives," she said.

She said by donating money, volunteering at the Foundation, raising awareness about healthcare initiatives, partnering in fundraising events, providing in-kind donations, or participating in corporate matching programs, everyone could make a real difference.

"Your contribution is more than just donations. They empower patients to fight for a life of purpose. They see their dreams within reach, and they contribute their unique talents to the world. With each other, we are making a real impact," she said.
